Badminton: Grace in Motion

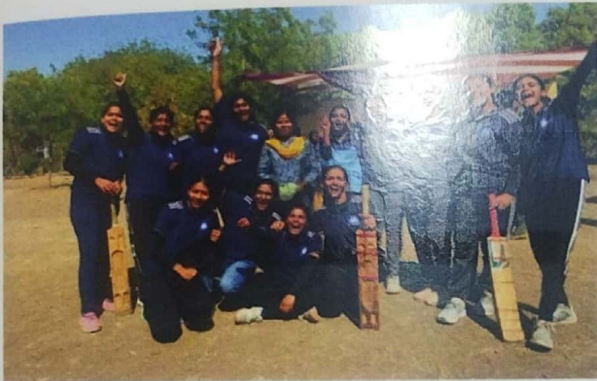
On 22nd January, the **Badminton Tournament** was organized at the First Year Building's court, featuring 12 boys and 9 girls.

Cricket: Teamwork and Tenacity

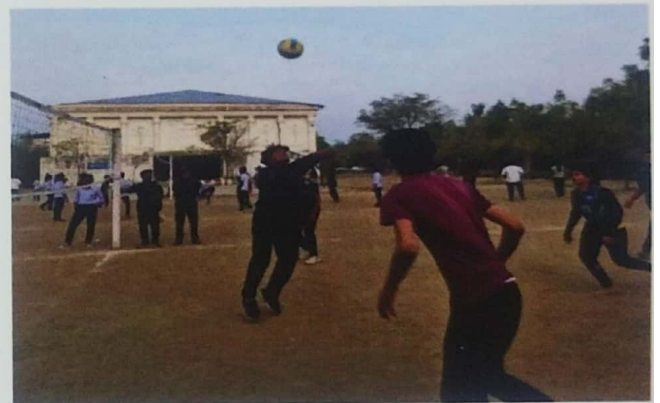

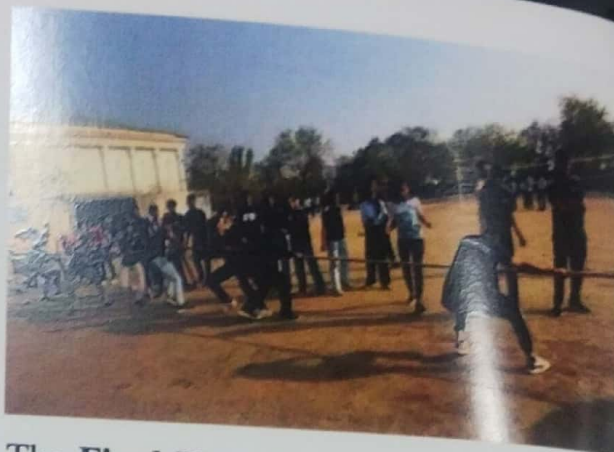

Tug of War: Strength in Unity

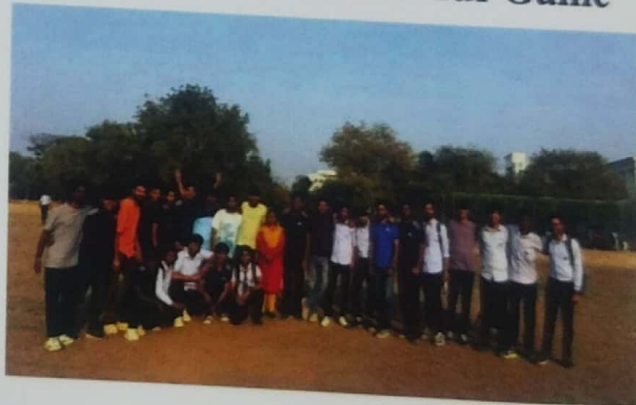


The timeless test of strength, **Tug-of-War**, was held on 6th February. It saw fierce participation from 9 boys and 8 girls per team.

Mock Placement Competition:

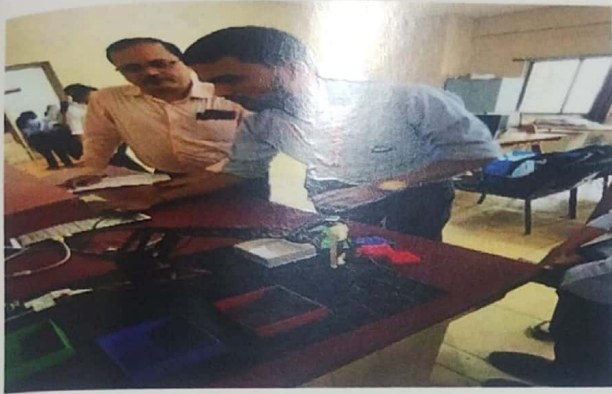

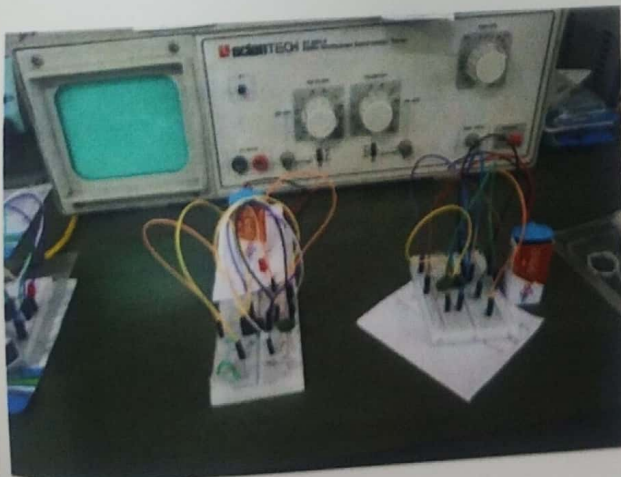
Project Competition (VIII Semester):
